The theme of the 15<sup>th</sup> China-ASEAN Prosecutors-General Conference is "Combatting Money Laundering and Corruption, and Recovering Assets in the Technological Age". The relationship between crime and technology is becoming increasingly intricate in today's digital age. Constant technological advancements and the rapid growth of global markets are increasingly being exploited by a new breed of criminals. The possibility of dissipating assets instantly online and the ease of global reach provide incentives for engaging in criminal behaviour in the virtual world, resulting in the emergence of novel criminal trends and an increasing prevalence of crimes relating to corruption and money laundering. While technological innovations pose considerable challenges to law enforcement agencies and prosecuting authorities in tracking and identifying criminals, they also play a pivotal role in effective crime prevention, detection, investigation and prosecution.

Against this background, the conference will explore how law enforcement agencies and prosecuting authorities can better equip themselves in combatting crime and recovering assets in the technological age. Jurisdictions will have an opportunity to engage in in-depth discussions on topics such as utilisation of international cooperation mechanisms for mutual assistance, and potential collaboration between counterparts in tackling the challenges of decentralisation. The conference will also look into how technology can be incorporated into the criminal justice system to facilitate prosecution services and mutual exchange of information and know-how.

Not just an international city, Hong Kong is a Special Administrative Region ("SAR") of the People's Republic of China and part of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area. From an international financial centre to one of the world's most visited tourist destinations; from a place teeming with historical buildings to a city filled with modern arts, you are visiting Hong Kong, a city of uniqueness and diversity.

Under the Basic Law, the Hong Kong SAR enjoys executive, legislative and independent judicial power, including that of final adjudication, and the common law system is preserved in Hong Kong, making it the only common law jurisdiction in China.

The Hong Kong SAR is committed to the rule of law and its robust legal system.

#### **©** Emergency Service

The emergency number for the police, ambulance service, fire department and other emergency services is 999, available 24 hours a day. For the speech or hearing impaired, a call for assistance may be made via SMS to 992.

#### Time Zone

The standard time zone in Hong Kong is eight hours ahead of UTC (UTC+08:00).

#### International Dialing Code

The international dialing code for Hong Kong is +852.

#### **③ Currency, ATMs & Money Exchange**

The official currency in Hong Kong is the Hong Kong dollar (HKD). ATMs can be found almost everywhere. Most ATMs take international cards and some also provide foreign currency withdrawal services. You can exchange your cash at any authorised money exchanger. Most money exchangers within the city are open until the evening, while those at the Hong Kong International Airport are open from early morning till late at night. Four Seasons Hotel Hong Kong also provides money exchange service at their 24-hour reception counter.

#### **S** Payment Methods

International credit cards are welcome at many hotels, shops, and restaurants in Hong Kong. Some stores also accept mobile payment. You can find out which payment methods are accepted by checking the signs displayed at the entrance or cash register of the store.

Another convenient option is the Octopus card, a stored value smart payment tool that allows you to pay cash-free at major public transports, convenience stores, supermarkets, and restaurants with just a simple tap. The cards can be bought and topped up at 7-Eleven and Circle K convenience stores and MTR stations, or you can download the Octopus App for Tourists on your mobile phone.

#### Shopping and Opening Hours

Retail shops generally open from 10:00 to 19:00 daily, although those in popular shopping areas such as Central, Causeway Bay and Tsim Sha Tsui often stay open until 21:30 or 22:00, especially on weekends. Restaurants tend to stay open until around 23:00, while bars and clubs, as well as some fast food outlets, stay open until the early hours of the morning.

#### 🖺 Sales Tax

All goods, other than alcohol and tobacco, are tax-free in Hong Kong. However, all retail businesses will charge a minimum levy of HK\$1 for each plastic shopping bag provided to customers in order to reduce waste and protect the environment.

#### **①** Electricity

The standard electrical voltage in Hong Kong is 220 volts AC, 50 Hz. The majority of electrical outlets in Hong Kong take a three-pronged UK-style plug.

#### ি Wi-Fi

Free Wi-Fi services are widespread in Hong Kong. In particular, there are many Wi-Fi.HK hotspots widely available across the city in locations such as major tourist attractions, shopping malls, parks and gardens, visitor centres, sports venues, museums, ferry terminals, cooked food centres and government buildings, which offer wireless internet connection completely free or free for a period of time. Free Wi-Fi access is also available at most seating and public areas in the passenger terminals of the Hong Kong International Airport, and in the concourse and platforms of every MTR station.

#### Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in all indoor public places in Hong Kong, including restaurants, bars, malls, on public transport carriers and within public transport facilities.
